No New Cases of COVID-19 in Chautauqua County Today

Chautauqua County statistics:

- 42 confirmed cases;
- 6 active cases continue to recover under orders of the Local Health Official per NYS Public Health Law;
- 32 recovered cases;
- 4 deaths;
- 95 cases under quarantine/isolation orders by the Public Health Director and being monitored. Not all of those being monitored are confirmed to have COVID-19 but have either shown symptoms, are awaiting results, or have risk factors; and
- 1,335 negative test results to date.
