### Amend Resolution 148-20 Authorizing Landfill Renewable Natural Gas (RNG) Agreements with Chautauqua Green Energy LLC (CGE)

By Public Facilities and Audit & Control Committees:

At the Request of County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 148-20 the County Executive was authorized to enter into a lease agreement (Agreement) with Chautauqua Green Energy LLC (CGE) to enable the development of an RNG facility at the County Landfill, with specified Agreement terms and conditions; and

WHEREAS, one such term and condition was that the RNG plant be completed within twenty-four (24) months of execution of the lease agreement; and

WHEREAS, NY Green Bank (the Bank), a division of the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA), is providing financing to CGE for the project, including an advance of funds prior to receipt of all necessary project permits, which will enable CGE to make initial lease payments to the County and which will also enable CGE to make other RNG plant-related expenditures that have a long lead time; and

WHEREAS, although obtaining the final project permits is expected to be routine, the Bank is required to secure its advances to CGE with sufficient collateral available to repay the Bank even in the unlikely event that the RNG plant, for lack of permits or otherwise, is delayed or not able to be constructed; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provides that CGE has the right during the full term of the Agreement to operate both the County's existing gas-to-energy plant and the RNG facility to be constructed, and seven (7) years of potential revenue from the existing gas-to-energy plant alone is a sufficient collateral source of revenue to enable the Bank to make its initial advances to CGE described above; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the first paragraph of Resolution 148-20 is hereby amended as follows to enable CGE to provide the Bank sufficient collateral for the Bank's advance of funds to CGE prior to the receipt of all necessary project permits for the RNG plant project:

1. <u>RNG Plant and Infrastructure</u>. CGE, at its sole expense, shall design, construct, operate, and maintain an RNG plant and infrastructure at the County Landfill, to be completed within <u>the earlier of</u> twenty-four (24) months <u>from the receipt of all</u> <u>necessary permits for the project</u>, or within eighty-four (84) months of execution of the lease agreement. Unless the County elects to purchase the RNG plant and infrastructure upon the termination of the lease agreement, CGE, at its sole expense, shall also be responsible for the decommissioning and removal of the RNG plant and infrastructure except for buried facilities, such as pipelines, which may be abandoned in place.
