<u>LOCAL LAW INTRO. 1-20 – A Local Law Providing Solid Waste Flow Control in Chautauqua County</u>

Legislator Gould: I move that the local law be amended as shown in Print 2 of the local law, which contains the amendments included in the pre-file packet that were recommended by the Audit & Control Committee, and one additional grammatical edit.

Legislator Nazzaro: Second.

Chairman Chagnon: Is there any discussion on this motion to amend the local law print 2?

Legislator Nazzaro: I just want to emphasize the importance of these two amendments. The one is that they are both positive amendments. The one is that the Legislature intends to maintain the County solid waste historical economic rate structure for the benefit of the incounty users and we will continue to operate the solid waste system in a manner that provides a competitive business environment for the County's residents and industries. So, this is to protect our residents (*inaudible*.) Also, the other amendment under section 3, flow control B- this will protect those (*inaudible*) for waste process pursuant to environment sustainably programs that are approved by the deputy director of the landfill that these will be allowed to separate organic waste and other items. This gives us some flexibility for those industries that have those type of programs. Thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you. Are there any other questions or comments on the motion amend local law 1-20? All those in favor of the motion to amend local law 1-20 please say aye. Opposed?

Unanimously Carried to Amend

Clerk Tampio: Mr. Chairman and legislators, I have received a message of necessity regarding the local law introductory 1-20 from Paul M. Wendel, Jr., County Executive. "I hereby certify that immediate passage of Print 2 of Local Law Introductory No.

1-20, entitled "A Local Law Providing for Solid Waste Flow Control in Chautauqua County," is necessary in order to facilitate the execution of proposed renewable natural gas (RNG) agreements pursuant to Resolution 148-20."

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you. I will entertain a motion from Legislator Bankoski. Would you read the motion?

Legislator Bankoski: I don't have it in front of me.

Legislator Nazzaro: I would be happy to read it. I move that debate and action proceed on Print 2 of the local law to allow for its immediate passage.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you. Legislator Bankoski, is that the motion that you're making?

Legislator Bankoski: Yes sir.

Legislator Vanstrom: Second.

Chairman Chagnon: Is there any discussion or question on the discussion on the motion to proceed with immediate passage of print 2 of local law 1-20? A. Calling on the State of New York to Release Enhanced Federal Medicaid Matching Funds to Counties and New York City

Chairman Chagnon: Are there any questions or comments on the motion?

Legislator Nazzaro: Mr. Chairman, I thank you and our County Executive for bringing this motion before the county legislature. I will, without hesitation, support this because as we read this motion it's the understanding that the State of New York has already received money from the federal government for FMAP to the tune of \$2.5 billion for the period of January 1, 2020 through June 30, 2020 and the federal law requires that a portion of these funds be passed to the counties, as well as New York City. As we all know, the federal government approved a 6.2% increase in the federal Medicaid medical assistance percentage, known as FMAP. Also, what is even more disturbing as I read down the motion in the last whereas, the State of New York has also been holding for roughly 3 years similar payments for FMAP that is owed to counties and New York City. I certainly encourage all of my fellow legislators to support this and I hope New York State takes action on this, not only for Chautauqua County, but all counties and New York City that are suffering and could use these federal monies that are due us. Thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you that was very well said. Are there any other questions or comments?

Clerk Tampio: Mr. Chairman, as part of the protocol we need to know that there's support of a majority of legislators to bring this to the floor.
