WHEREAS, this mentorship program will help to ensure that local health departments have the support necessary to start or expand vector control programs to fit their community's needs; and

WHEREAS, participants in the VCC will be awarded funding in the amount of \$10,000 for the period March 14, 2022 through July 31, 2022; and

Indoor Radon Grants Program Funding

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County has been awarded New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) State Indoor Radon Grants Program funding in the amount of \$10,000 annually for the period June 1, 2022 to May 31, 2027; and

WHEREAS, the primary purpose of this funding is to conduct radon outreach and education programs designed to reduce the public health risk from exposure to indoor radon; and

WHEREAS, this program will allow the Chautauqua County Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to educate County residents about radon and the dangers of radon exposure, and to partner with schools, physician offices and outside agencies to provide educational materials and distribute radon detectors; and

WHEREAS, this program will allow DHHS to utilize its lead programming operations for assistance with testing and remediation suggestions; and

WHEREAS, revenues and appropriations associated with this award were not included in the 2022 Adopted Budget; now therefore be it
