TITLE: Authorizing Lease of Office Space in the City of Dunkirk

BY: Public Facilities and Audit & Control Committees:

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, the County desires to lease from Agricultural Land Holdings, LLC approximately 10,500 square feet of office space located at 15 West Lucas Avenue, in the City of Dunkirk, for use by the Chautauqua County Department of Social Services; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is hereby authorized and empowered to execute a lease agreement with Agricultural Land Holdings, LLC, upon substantially the following terms and conditions:

- 1. <u>Premises</u>. Approximately 10,500 square feet of office space in the property located at 15 West Lucas Avenue in the City of Dunkirk.
- 2. Term. January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2032.
- 3. Base Rent. Annual rate of \$15.05 per square foot, to be increased by 3.5% per year.
- 4. <u>Build-Outs</u>. New flooring, ceiling tiles, painting, and upgraded LED office lighting (not to exceed \$75,000) and generator repair (not to exceed \$5,000) will be provided by Landlord as part of the annual square foot rate.
- 5. <u>Snowplowing, Shoveling, and Salting</u>. Included in annual rate per square foot.
- 6. <u>Cleaning Services</u>. Daily office cleaning included in annual rate per square foot.
- 7. <u>Parking Lot Sealing and Striping</u>. Included in annual rate per square foot and performed every two (2) years.
- 8. <u>Taxes and Utilities</u>. Landlord is responsible for all taxes and utilities attributable to the leased premises, including water, sewer, gas, and electricity. County is responsible for the cost of its phone and internet services, including installation fees.
- 9. Other. As negotiated by the County Executive.

TITLE: Acceptance of the Federal Transit Administration COVID Relief Funds

for Operating Assistance

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel Jr.:

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County has been recommended as eligible to receive supplemental funding under the COVID Relief Funds for Operating Assistance, from the programs and in the amounts shown below:

1. Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA): \$ 970,000

2. American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA): \$1,300,000

; and

WHEREAS, supplemental CRRSAA and ARPA funding may be used at up to a federal share of 100 percent and may be used for any eligible activity authorized under the Formula Rural Area Program; and

WHEREAS, CRRSAA and ARPA funding may also be used for all operating expenses (net of fare revenues) necessary to operate, maintain, and manage a public transportation system, including such costs as drivers, salaries, fuel and items having a useful life of less than one year, including personal protective equipment and cleaning supplies; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is authorized to sign all necessary documents and agreements with the State of New York to receive funding for all projects.

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CHAUTAUOUA COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. CARTS – Section 5311 Consolidation Operating and Capital Grant TITLE: **Application Request** BY: Public Facilities and Audit & Control Committees: **AT THE REQUEST OF:** County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.: WHEREAS, pursuant to a Federal Transit Operation Assistance Agreement between Chautauqua County and New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT), valid through 12/31/2022 (C004063 /19-25-17), the County may apply to NYSDOT for federal and operating assistance for the provision of mass transportation services pursuant to 49 USC 5311; and WHEREAS, the County is submitting such an application to NYSDOT covering State fiscal years 2022 and 2023; and WHEREAS, the grant application has three components, including (i) funding for replacement vehicles and equipment, and a mobility manager; (ii) operating funds; and (iii) Appalachian funds; and WHEREAS, the estimated costs of the first component of the grant application is estimated to be \$2,362,229 to be borne at the ratio of 80% Federal (\$1,889,783.20), 10% New York State (\$236,222.90), and 10% County (\$236,222.90); and WHEREAS, the Federal share for the second component of the grant application (operating funds) is expected to be \$389,500 for grant fiscal years 2022 and \$397,500 for fiscal year 2023, with a required 100% funding match from the County; and WHEREAS, the thirds component of the grant application (Appalachian Funds) includes \$35,000 per year to support a city bus route, with a required 100% funding match from the County; now therefore be it RESOLVED, That the County Executive is authorized and empowered to execute the 2022-2023 grant application and all other documents necessary to apply for, progress and receive such grant funds.
