AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul J. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, Lake Erie is an invaluable economic asset to Chautauqua County, but excessive erosion of the bluffs at Wright Park Beach in the City of Dunkirk is adversely impacting usability of the beaches; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County Soil and Water Conservation District ("District") has been approach by the City of Dunkirk's Department of Public Works to partner on a project to address the continual state of erosion of the bluffs; and

WHEREAS, the District is focusing on an approach to address groundwater at the site through installation of drainage along Wright Park Drive; and

WHEREAS, the District proposes to partner with the Chautauqua Watershed Conservancy to install shrub plantings along the base of the bluff to provide protection during events in which waves reach the bluff; and

WHEREAS, the Wright Park Drive project is expected to cost \$20,000 with \$15,000 going towards material and installation of the drainage system and \$5,000 dedicated to plant materials and installation; and

WHEREAS, the 2% Occupancy Tax Program Reserve has a balance of \$472,651 for projects of special opportunity and need; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature designates \$20,000 from the 2% Occupancy Tax Program Reserve to reimburse the District for its cost to implement the project; and be it further

Funding from the Phase I ARPA allocation and other sources falls well short of what is necessary to cover the significant costs of assembling a large site, undertaking the due diligence, and stubbing in the needed infrastructure, and for that reason we are requesting more funding. Budget amendments are necessary to authorize spending for the project; now therefore be it

TITLE: Authorize Agreement with Chautauqua Region Economic Development Corporation for Greenway Development

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County is known for its rural charm, and natural assets, and has a vibrant tourism economy; and

WHEREAS, in the last few years, there is renewed momentum with additional interest in collaboration among several individual trail groups in the County, and new resources being invested into Chautauqua County's trail systems; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Greenway Plan, adopted by the Legislature in 2013, advocates for further development of the County's trail systems and defines steps for Chautauqua County and various stakeholders to take in order to:

- Formalize and maintain the county's rural outdoor lifestyle;
- Fulfill the desire for Chautauqua County to be recognized as a four season destination for active living and outdoor recreation; and,
- Capitalize on the positive economic impact that can be realized through providing amenities that visitors to our county desire; and

WHEREAS, one of the Greenway Plan's goals is to create a stakeholder group to establish goals and advocate for resources; formalize delivery and implementation strategies of trail and greenways development among the County and its partners; pursue resources collaboratively; foster partnerships between conservation and recreation organizations, public agencies, landowners, private sector companies, local municipalities, and dedicated individuals; and promote, educate, and facilitate Trail Town concepts in local communities and business districts; and

WHEREAS, the County and several trail-related partners have formed a collaborative stakeholder group ("the Friends of the Chautauqua County Greenways") as a component of the Chautauqua Region Economic Development Corporation ("CREDC") and it's public/private economic development collaborative, the Chautauqua County Partnership for Economic Growth ("CCPEG"); and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Legislature has appropriated funds to support CREDC and CCPEG with its efforts to advance the Friends of the Chautauqua County Greenways initiative in its 2023 Adopted Budget; now therefore be it
