TITLE: Amend Funding Supplemental Agreement No.3 with NY State DOT for

Performance of Federal Aid Project PIN 5761.82

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolutions 161-17, 68-21,18-22, 61-22 and 142-22, the Chautauqua County Legislature approved the Replacement of County Bridge 1082, Foote Ave (the Project) and committed to \$2,470,000 to cover 100% of the Project's Preliminary Engineering Design I-VI and Right-of-Way Incidental Phases and Construction/Construction Inspection Phases; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation had issued Supplemental Agreement No. 3, with funding under title 23 U.S. Code, for the Construction/Construction Inspection Phases, which called for the apportionment of the costs of such program, estimated to be \$2,884,000, to be \$2,307,200 Federal Funds, \$304,500 State Marchiselli funds, and \$272,300 local funds; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation has issued a revised executed Supplemental Agreement No.3, with funding under title 23 U.S. Code, for the construction/Construction Inspection Phases, which now calls for the apportionment of the costs of such program to be \$2,884,000, to be \$2,307,200 Federal Funds, \$432,600 State Marchiselli funds, and \$144,200 local funds; and

WHEREAS, the local share is now calculated to decrease by \$128,100, and the sum of \$128,100 has been appropriated from D.5112.390 for the Replacement of County Bridge 1082, Foote Ave (The Project) and should be returned to D.5112.390; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua hereby approves the above-subject project; and it is further

RESOLVED, That the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua hereby authorizes the County of Chautauqua to pay in the first instance 100% of the Federal and Non-Federal shares of the cost of the Project or portions thereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, That in the event the full federal and nonfederal share costs of the Project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the County of Chautauqua shall convene its Legislature as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the New York State Department of Transportation thereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, That the County Executive of the County of Chautauqua be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid on behalf of the County of Chautauqua with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the Municipality's first instance funding of Project costs and permanent funding of the local share of Federal-Aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible; and it is further

RESOLVED, That a certified copy of this Resolution be filed with the New York State Commissioner of Transportation by attaching it to any necessary Agreement in connection with the Project; and it is further

RESOLVED, That this Resolution shall take effect immediately and that the Director of Finance is directed to make the following changes to the 2022 Adopted Budget:

TITLE: Restore Essential Air Service to the Chautauqua County Airport/Jamestown

AT THE REQUEST OF: Legislator Thomas Nelson:

Whereas, the Jamestown Airport had commercial passenger air service for over 60 years until January 16, 2018, when the Federal Government terminated Essential Air Service (EAS) to Jamestown, New York due to low passenger counts and

Whereas, the reason for low passenger counts was the inability of the EAS carrier at the time to dependably serve the Jamestown Airport out of Pittsburgh, mainly due to a pilot shortage and

Whereas, the Greater Jamestown Area should not be punished for a low passenger count due to undependable air service, and

Whereas, it is important to the economic development of Chautauqua County that visitors be able to fly to Jamestown to visit the National Comedy Center and other nearby attractions such as Chautauqua Institution, and

Whereas, it is important to current and future businesses in the Greater Jamestown Area to be able to fly in and out of Jamestown, and

Whereas, Bradford (McKean County) Pennsylvania, which is much smaller than the Greater Jamestown Area has dependable EAS service to Pittsburgh and to Washington (Dulles),

Now be it Moved as follows: The Chautauqua County Legislature calls upon Congressman Nick Langworthy, Senator Charles Schumer and Senator Kirsten Gillibrand to request that US Secretary of Transportation, Pete Buttigieg, restore EAS to Chautauqua County Airport/Jamestown.
