WHEREAS, Pursuant to New York State Real Property Tax Law, certain enrolled members of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or incorporated voluntary ambulance service or spouses are eligible for a partial exemption from real property taxes; and

WHEREAS, The Chautauqua County Legislature, recognizing the important contributions of these volunteers, as well as the recruiting crisis currently affecting local departments, wishes to consider adopting the tax exemption as set out in Real Property Tax Law 466-a; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature hereby authorizes a public hearing pursuant to Section 10 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law to be held on a local law adopting the tax exemption as set out in Real Property Tax Law 466-a, to be prepared and finalized by the County Law Department; and be it further

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) on March 11, 2021, and this legislation contains a wide array of stimulus and recovery funding designed to ensure the nation's swift economic and public health recovery from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County received an award of \$24,649,420 in ARPA funding, all of which is available for general county spending based on the Treasury Department's revenue loss formula and other guidance; and

WHEREAS, an ARPA working group consisting of the County Executive, several legislators, and several department heads worked for many months to create an ARPA Spending Plan (Plan) consisting of priority projects to address the key strategic categories as defined by the Department of Treasury, to be sustainable, and to have a County-wide impact; and

WHEREAS, the Plan, consisting of the priority projects, was thoroughly reviewed by the ARPA working group, the County Executive, and the County Legislature and was adopted pursuant to Resolution No. 202-21; and

WHEREAS, the District Attorney Office Expansion Project ("Project") was identified as one of the priority projects recommended in Resolution No. 202-21 and, pursuant to Resolution No. 298-21, a budget of \$70,000 was established for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost for the Project is \$100,000, which is \$30,000 over the original approved budget, so budget amendments are necessary to authorize additional spending for the Project and ensure its complete implementation; now therefore be it

WHEREAS, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) on March 11, 2021, and this legislation contains a wide array of stimulus and recovery funding designed to ensure the nation's swift economic and public health recovery from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County received an award of \$24,649,420 in ARPA funding, all of which is available for general county spending based on the Treasury Department's revenue loss formula and other guidance; and

WHEREAS, an ARPA Spending Plan was thoroughly reviewed by an ARPA working group, the County Executive, and the County Legislature, and was adopted pursuant to Resolution No. 202-21; and

WHEREAS, some funds allocated in the ARPA Spending Plan are no longer needed for the originally designated project(s), and are now available for other projects, and a procedure has been established for the ARPA working group to review new requests for APPA funds and to allocate the available funds; and

WHEREAS, the Dispatch Furniture Replacement Project fits within the guidelines for ARPA spending, and is needed because the current furniture in the Mayville Dispatch Center is over 15 years old, and replacement parts are no longer supported. The "back-up" center, located in Jamestown, was put into service, using used furniture, during Covid and currently remains open; and

WHEREAS, budget amendments are necessary to authorize spending for the project; now therefore be it
