WHEREAS, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) on March 11, 2021, and this legislation contains a wide array of stimulus and recovery funding designed to ensure the nation's swift economic and public health recovery from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County received an award of \$24,649,420 in ARPA funding, all of which is available for general county spending based on the Treasury Department's revenue loss formula and other guidance; and

WHEREAS, an ARPA Spending Plan was thoroughly reviewed by an ARPA working group, the County Executive, and the County Legislature, and was adopted pursuant to Resolution No. 202-21; and

WHEREAS, some funds allocated in the ARPA Spending Plan are no longer needed for the originally designated project(s), and are now available for other projects, and a procedure has been established for the ARPA working group to review new requests for APPA funds and to allocate the available funds; and

WHEREAS, the Morgue project fits within the guidelines for ARPA spending, is needed to serve as temporary housing spot for decedents and to serve as part of the County's mass disaster plan, and budget amendments are necessary to authorize spending for the project; now therefore be it

LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NO. 1-24 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW 13-22 PROVIDING FOR A MANAGEMENT SALARY PLAN FOR COUNTY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES (re: ADMINISTRATIVE COODINATOR FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH)

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York, as follows:

Section 1. <u>Purpose.</u>

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the Management Salary Plan set forth in Local Law 13-22, and as amended, to set the salary for Administrative Coordinator for Department of Health.

Section 2. Salary Levels.

The title of Administrative Coordinator for Department of Health shall be placed in Range 5 (\$53,674 - \$82,248) of the 2024 Management Salary Plan.

Section 3. <u>Severability.</u>

In the event any provisions or part of this Local Law shall for any reason be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of the Local Law.

Section 4. <u>Effective Date.</u>

This Local Law shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW 13-22 PROVIDING FOR A MANAGEMENT SALARY PLAN FOR COUNTY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

(Re: Deputy Compliance Officer)

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York, as follows:

Section 1. <u>Purpose.</u>

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the Management Salary Plan set forth in Local Law 13-22, as amended, to set a non-schedule salary range for the position of Deputy Compliance Officer. The position of Deputy Compliance Officer is an additional title which may be designated by the County Executive for a department head in Range 12 or above of the Management Salary Plan. In addition to their department head duties, the Deputy Compliance Officer will assist the Compliance Officer as directed. The Deputy Compliance Officer will, in the absence of a Compliance Officer, be the point of contact on all compliance questions and issues, directly consult with the Compliance Committee, assist in the formulation of Countywide compliance policies and procedures, and performs such other duties as legally mandated of a Compliance Officer.

Section 2. Salary Level.

The position of Deputy Compliance Officer shall have a non-scheduled salary range of \$5,000 to \$92,778, which shall be in addition to the regular salary of the department head designated with the title.

Section 3. Severability.

In the event any provisions or part of this Local Law shall for any reason be adjusted invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of the Local Law.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Spending Plan

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) on March 11, 2021, and this legislation contains a wide array of stimulus and recovery funding designed to ensure the nation's swift economic and public health recovery from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County received an award of \$24,600,000 in ARPA funding, of which \$18,219,169 is available for general county spending based on the Treasury Department's revenue loss formula and other guidance, and the remaining \$6,380,831 in funding can only be spent on designated ARPA categories including premium pay; water, sewer, and broadband projects; and responding to the COVID-19 pandemic and its associated economic impacts; and

WHEREAS, an ARPA Committee consisting of the County Executive, several legislators, and several department heads worked for many months to create an ARPA Spending Plan (Plan) consisting of priority projects to address the key strategic categories as defined by the Department of Treasury, to be sustainable, and to have a County-wide impact; and

WHEREAS, the Plan, consisting of the priority projects, was thoroughly reviewed by the ARPA Committee, the County Executive, and the County Legislature and was adopted pursuant to Resolution No. 202-21; and

WHEREAS, the Marketing Assistance to Businesses and Not-for-Profits project, identified as one of the priority projects recommended in Resolution 202-21, received \$400,000 in funding in November 2021 via an ARPA allocation, a significant portion of which (\$320,679) was used to provide grants to businesses for marketing upgrades; and

WHEREAS, the CCIDA partnered with CCCC and JCC SBDC to establish a program that would support businesses throughout the County to provide them with grants of up to \$10,000 to upgrade their marketing presence, which includes branding, website development, social media, signage, etc.; and
