WHEREAS, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) on March 11, 2021, and this legislation contains a wide variety of stimulus and recovery funding designed to ensure the nation's swift economic and public health recovery from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County received an award of \$24,649,420 in ARPA funding, all of which is available for general county spending based on the Treasury Department's revenue loss formula and other guidance; and

WHEREAS, an ARPA Spending Plan was thoroughly reviewed by an ARPA working group, the County Executive, and the County Legislature, and was adopted pursuant to resolution No. 202-21; and

WHEREAS, some funds allocated in the ARPA Spending Plan are no longer needed for the originally designed project(s), and are now available for other projects, and a procedure has been established for the ARPA working group to review new requests for ARPA funds and to allocate the available funds; and

WHEREAS, the State of New York has implemented Raise the Age Legislation which requires swift attendance of Probation staff in the Youth Part of Chautauqua County Court in Mayville; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 274-19, since, 2019, the Chautauqua County Probation Department has leased space attached to the Town of Chautauqua Office Building to allow the Probation Department to effectively meet the goals of the Raise the Age Legislation; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate for the County to continue to lease the space, now from the Town of Chautauqua as owner, under the same terms or conditions as the previous lease; and

WHEREAS, revenues and expenditures associated with this lease are included in the approved State of New York Raise the Age Plan, the 2024 Budget and are being proposed in the 2025 Budget; now therefore be it
