WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Chautauqua County Public Defender's Office to use the grant money, in part, to fund five (5) full-time Discovery Expediter positions; one (1) full-time Sr. Case Worker position; one (1) full-time Investigator position; enter into a contract with JusticeText or another comparable vendor to expedite the review of body camera footage, jail phone calls, etc. to improve the outcome for clients; and purchase two (2) vehicles to better serve clients; and
