LEAD PAINT POISONS KIDS!

Lead poisoning can cause **permanent learning and behavior problems**, but **lead poisoning is PREVENTABLE**.

Over 85% of homes in Chautauqua were built prior to 1978. Our children are at high risk for lead poisoning. Our Lead Poisoning Prevention Team will check for lead paint in any pre-1978 built home in Chautauqua County where a child under 6 spends 6 or more hours per week.

Ticks are out in full force this year! Here are a few great parent/student resources that you can send home with students to remind them of the dangers of ticks and how to protect themselves.




