DECLARATION OF A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY -EXTENSION AS OF OCTOBER 15, 2024- (Sustainable Migration)

I hereby declare, pursuant to Executive Law §24, a State of Emergency to exist in Chautauqua County.

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2023, pursuant to the authority vested in me as County Executive of Chautauqua County under Executive Law §24 I declared a State of Emergency; and

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2023, I issued Emergency Order No. 1 (Chautauqua County Sustainable Migration Protocol) which has been extended on several occasions; and


WHEREAS, there still exists the potential that New York City may unilaterally move hundreds of individuals to Chautauqua County with no notice; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County continues to struggle with the natural and organic migration of people into the County, including low income housing shortages and school districts rapidly gaining population, stressing services without the unneeded, unnecessary, and unnatural spike in population New York City's program will cause by the mass transportation of persons to Chautauqua County; **now it is declared that**


A State of Emergency continues to exist in Chautauqua County; and
