About the Mobile Crisis Team

A Mobile Crisis Team (MCT) is a group of behavioral health professionals including a social worker and peer specialist who can provide care and short-term management for people who are experiencing a behavioral/mental health crisis.

Integrated services are primarily provided in people's homes and the community. Mobile Crisis Teams are available throughout Chautauqua County.

Mobile Crisis Teams respond to referrals Monday - Friday between 8 am and 4:30 pm and can be reached at **716-363-3684**. The goal is to provide an in-person visit within two hours of receiving a referral.

Additional services after 4:30 pm and on weekends are available through the hotline at **1-800-724-0461**.

Services Provided

Mobile Crisis Teams can provide short- term mental health service, intervention and follow-up to help people remain connected with treatment providers. The teams may offer a range of services, including:

- Assessment
- De-escalation
- Crisis Intervention
- Supportive Counseling
- Information and Referrals *

*referrals are to community-based mental health services

Transport to Psychiatric ER

If a Mobile Crisis Team determines that a person in crisis needs further psychiatric or medical assessment, they can arrange for that person to be transported to a hospital psychiatric emergency room.

Mobile Crisis Teams collaborate with EMS or police to take a person to an emergency room. NYS Mental Hygiene Law may require this only if they have a metal illness (or the appearance of a mental illness) and are a danger to themselves or others.

Request a Team

You can request help from a Mobile Crisis Team if you are concerned about a family member, friend or acquaintance who is experiencing, or at risk of, a psychological crisis. You can also request a team for yourself. To do so call the Mobile Crisis Team (MCT) at **716-363-3684**.
