## RELATIONSHIP WHEN THEY ARE "NEXT OF KIN"

Spouse or legal domestic partner	Always
Child	Always, unless parental rights were terminated via adoption. If child has not reached the age of 18, you may move on to the next relationship on the list.
Grandchild	When the child/parent who the decedent/grandchild have in common is deceased. <i>If grandchild has not reached the age of 18, you may move on to the next relationship on the list.</i>
Great Grandchild	When the decedent had none of the above surviving at the time of death. <i>If great grandchild has not reached the age of 18, you may move on to the next relationship on the list.</i>
Parent	When the decedent had no children or grandchildren (issue) surviving at time of death, or where none of the decedent's surviving issue have reached the age of 18.
Sibling	When the decedent had none of the above surviving at the time of death. This applies to full and half, but not step, siblings.
Grandparent	When the decedent had none of the above surviving at the time of death.
Other Relatives	If none of the above apply, call or email Legal or the Law Department.
