an attempt to collect and table various sources of information relating to individuals buried in the original Town of Dunkirk Cemetery, some of whom were removed to Forest Hill, some of whom have still legible stones there, and others about whom we may never know for sure by Jo Ann Kaufman, 2013

Cemetery Names and abbreviations:

The original Town of Dunkirk Cemetery (**TDC**) is presently the NW corner of St. Mary's Cemetery (SMC), Bennett Road, Dunkirk, NY. [East side of Route 60, North of the Thruway interchange; see findagrave.com for map] aka Old German Cemetery (1), Town of Dunkirk Cemetery and Potter's Field (1); Dunkirk German Burying Ground (4:43)

Dunkirk Village Cemetery (**DVC**) used about 1809-1872, aka: Old Village Cemetery, Pioneer Cemetery, Eagle St. Cemetery (1) Forest Hill Cemetery (**FHC**) and possibly the adjacent Pioneer Cemetery, Fredonia, NY, present home of many relocated TDC folks

- 1850, Dunkirk VIg appropriated \$235 for the Dunkirk Cemetery (which? Assume DVC?) (4:43)
- 1851, St. Mary's Cemetery, first burials
- 1878, DVC property to School District, known remains reinterred by school authorities in TDC; some remains privately reinterred at FHC (1)
- 1880, some bodies found at corner of Swan St. and 6th St (site of old Village Cemetery) while constructing Dunkirk Academy; moved to TDC (1)
- 1895, DTC, 5 or 6 acres of shamefully neglected land; families do not own lots, town does but no control (summary of lengthy article, 4:41-42)
- 1895, Nov: skeletons found at former DVC while excavating for Dunkirk Academy; all bodies had been thought to have been exhumed and reburied in TDC
- 1903, St. Hyacinth Cemetery, first burials [prior to 1903, St. Mmary's was the only consecrated ground for Roman Catholic funerals]

(no mention of disposal of remains.) Source: 4:49 1936, Willowbrook Park Cemetery, first burials; includes Temple Beth El section 1969, Town Board officially sells TDC to St. Mary's Cemetery for the sum of \$1.00 (4:43)

General background information, by Lois Barris (4:41,43): [anything specific enough was removed from this material and tabled, but this is too interesting not to include here, too]

When Norwood and I read St Mary's Cemetery in 1991, we became interested in the most northerly section of that cemetery, the front part of which was formerly known as Dunkirk Town Cemetery, or just Dunkirk Cemetery. We read the few stones that remain in the old section and it seemed that, at some earlier time, this was the preferred resting place of those families of German descent that attended the small German Evangelical Churches in Dunkirk. The obituary of 8-year-old Charley, son of Charles & Mary Schlining, states that he was buried in the German Burying Ground on Bennett Rd. We inquired of both Dunkirk City and Town officials and could learn very little of the history of this cemetery. Its predominant attribute seemed to be that in later years it was used as "Potter's Field" and those buried there were not allowed or could not afford burial elsewhere. Today, under the caretakers of St Mary's Cemetery, this ground seems to have regained sacred status. Most of what we know about this cemetery, we read in the newspapers:

A letter in the *Evening Observer* 20 August 1914, page 8, piqued our curiosity about this cemetery. In our memory, there have been no iron gates, and we have no clue to the writer or the people of which he speaks: *Editor, Observer: Our Dunkirk Town Board has transformed that wilderness of our Dunkirk Cemetery into a garden of paradise, so to speak, compared to what it has been for the last thirty years. They will continue the good work next spring. It is curious that there is no record of this plot of land, here or in Mayville, being bought of donated to the City of Dunkirk. What city or town official can enlighten the supervisors on this matter? Also, there is no record of burials. But there is one old GAR soldier buried in the ditch behind the driveway's iron gates, north side, a very appropriate place for a GAR emblem to be decorated year after year for the last 15 years and no GAR official cognizant of that fact. Well, Mr Wilson was a soldier and a democrat and should have a honorable GAR burial; furthermore, his remains will be re-interred in the cemetery proper next September. Who did the job and by what authority? There are a number of persons who have relatives and friend laid to rest in that cemetery who wish to thank the gentlemen for their meritorious work. A Citizen.*

On July 20, 1910, a child in a metal coffin that was unearthed in excavation "100 feet north of 6th St near Swan," was reburied in the town cemetery.

On 24 Jan 1894 the Fredonia Censor carried this paragraph: It would be a wise move for Dunkirk citizens to organize a Cemetery Association and buy ground in some convenient location near that city. Forest Hill is not large enough for both towns and is filling up so rapidly that there will soon be no place for either community there, and it is not desirable to enlarge the grounds in that locality. For Fredonia alone, the unused portion of the Cemetery would last many years. A cemetery soon pays for itself, as the ground is bought by the acre and sold by the square foot.

The Dunkirk Observer editors notes: If it is true as reported, that Dunkirk citizens own more than one half of the stock of Forest Hill Cemetery, how would it do for residents of Fredonia to organize a Cemetery Association, and buy grounds in some convenient location near that beautiful village? The fact that Forest Hill is within the corporation limits of Fredonia should cut no figure, as the ownership of one person is just a legal and sacred as that of any other, without the least regard as to where he lives. Forest Hill cemetery is about the only thing in Fredonia that residents of this city have any ownership in; and it hurts our feeling to have a intimation that we are not wanted even there.

And in the Observer for 26 August 1895 is a rather long article headlined, "Neglected Ground – the condition of the Dunkirk Cemetery on the Bennett Road" with the subhead: Strange how such places are allowed to go unthought of or unlooked after. Nothing has been done to improve this cemetery within the last five years: Over on the Bennett Road and adjoining St Mary's Cemetery, to which improvement in general appearance is possible, lies another piece of land of five or six acres, whose use might puzzle the stranger, were it not that occasionally though the thick and lofty burdocks and other luxuriant growth of weeds and bushes, can be seen a glimpse of here and there a monument. This neglected spot in the cemetery devoted to the burial of friendless strangers and those who die without the means to buy a resting place in Forest Hill Cemetery.

In this plot of ground, other persons, some of them of considerable means, have selected lots, presumably with consent of the Town Board, who have supervision of the cemetery, and they have buried their dead there and put up monuments and headstone and cut the grass, but elsewhere, complete disorder has usually reigned.

Underbrush and weeds have so hidden the ground that it is difficult for the grave-digger to know where to use his pick and shovel.

Five years ago Jacob Miller secured subscriptions from business men and others, aggregating \$145, and an engineer presented him a suitable and tasteful plan for laying out the cemetery. Mr Miller proceeded to clear up the place and lay out plots and drives and walks according to the plan. The grass was cut and flower beds were filled with donated plants and the cemetery assumed a very respectable appearance. Soon after that time, about 15 new monuments were placed that have cost from \$100 to \$150 each. Since then, however, neglect has again stepped in and except in places where private lots are kept in order, chaos seems to reign again and the weeds overgrow even the walks and drives.

There is another trouble that also comes in to embarrass those who do take care of lots. No one owns a lot. The whole plot is town property and if, after someone has taken considerable time and trouble to improve a plot in which are buried the deceased members of his family, another prefers to lay his dead within the limits of the wellordered spot to making the new grave among the stout burdocks, their former occupant cannot prevent the seeming trespass, because he has no deed to the lot and no claim except possession. This encroachment by a second person upon ground already appropriated is said upon reliable authority to not infrequently extend to the invasion of even recently made graves, and other bodies of no kin to those first buried are laid to rest in the same grave in spite of protest against it. A case of this kind occurred recently when in less that two weeks after a young woman was buried the remains of another person were interred in the same grave.

It has been suggested that the Town Board, or whoever has charge of the cemetery, might by some proper business-like way of conducting the affairs of the Town Cemetery, so manage that it could be kept in an orderly condition and be nearly or quite self-supporting. The drives and walks could be put in proper condition and a book of record kept of the permits for burial and the location; and then if persons able to pay desired lots in this cemetery they could be allowed to have them at a specified rate and be protected in their rights. In this way, the income derived from the sale of lots and for taking care of them would probably meet the expense of keeping the whole place in order. There is no doubt of there being many persons who would be glad to have it so arranged that they can buy their lots and be safe from the intrusion of others.

From DO 14 Nov 1895, page 4, column 2, headed, "Gruesome Objects – Skeletons unearthed by workmen digging the Academy basement.

Three skeletons have been found by workmen who are digging the basement for the addition to the Academy. Two were unearthed yesterday afternoon and the third this morning. Ever since the work on the excavation began, it has been expected that the remains of people who were buried there long years ago would be turned up, but in what locality no one could say, for all the grave stones, markers, etc., were carted off when it was first decided to use the old burying ground for an academy lot. At the time the excavation was made for the present building, most of the bodies, in all over 250, were removed to the Dunkirk Cemetery on the Bennett road, and these that were found yesterday were so far away from the others that it was probable no search was made for them at the time. All three were found close together, a few feet from the southeast corner of the building. The first uncovered was that of an infant; the next that of a small woman, probably 17 or 18 years of age and the one found this morning is that of a man over six feet in height. There was nothing to identify any of them by and no one skeleton was complete, many of the bones having crumbled away. All traces of the coffins were gone except two or three metal handles, which were appropriated by the workmen as mementos of the occasion. At different places, the earth is darker than the rest, which goes to show that wood has rotted there; the wood must have been coffins or boxes, which, with their contents, have long since lost all semblance to form.

On 15 Nov 1895 another article: "More Skeletons Found - Excitement caused by empty graves in Academy lot"

Three or four more skeletons were found yesterday afternoon and this morning by the workmen who are making the excavation for the new academy basement. These were in very good condition and the coffins were still intact, though there were no marks of any kind to identify them.

Several graves were found this morning containing empty coffins and the diggers were greatly excited over this, for it looked as though body stealers had at some time or other been at work. This was afterwards explained by one of the Board of Education, who stated that these graves were opened at the time all the other bodies were exhumed and the remains taken out and buried in the Dunkirk Cemetery, while the coffins were left where they were and refilled with earth.

DO 8 JAN 1897 a copy of the will of John Wm Seeley, selected paragraphs extracted here: I hereby revoke a former will made by me to the benefit of the German Roman Catholic St George Church and especially to the school connected with said church at Ruggles & Lion St in Dunkirk NY, when an arrogant and untimely episcopality divided and nearly dissolved that said congregation and school by claiming even the property of the congregation and school, and thereby the contests of the will, for their selfish purposes.....It is my will that the village cemetery of Dunkirk be my place of interment, that no grave stone shall mark my burial place and that to avoid all controversies of a Catholic clergy after my death and before my interment the service of my funeral be conducted by a minister of some Protestant evangelical church and some remarks of a philosophical character shall be made by him at the grave......The will was recorded 11 April 1876.

DO 26 March 1898 carries a transcription of early Village of Dunkirk records found at that time in a vault in City Hall. Included in the record was an appropriation in 1850 of \$235 for the Dunkirk Cemetery.

DO 2 July 1969: At the Dunkirk town board meeting Tuesday Evening (July 1) it was announced that the town of Dunkirk's cemetery, located in Bennett road adjacent to St Mary's cemetery, has been sold to the St Mary's Cemetery Inc for the sum of \$1. The transfer will take place during the first part of August.

Dunkirk Journal Mar ? 1880: Body of Charles Parkes found on beach....colored barber drowned off the dock at Ambersburg on Candadian side of Lake Erie 14 Nov 1879.... Coroner Blood buried the body, it being impossible to keep it longer....Mother & sister of deceased live at Detroit....

Note: remember that this is a finding aid, not the final source for anything, and best information available definitely applies!

Names are spelled as in source and if corrected, both spellings are given using "as." Often, both newspaper and census spellings are incorrect but phonetic. For example, from the 1890s Town of Pomfret records: Kuczenski, Kuczniski and Kucznski could all be the same family – or not [warning: the 2b. index does not simplify things, either – more butchering of Polish names].

Dates are given year first to sort by date of birth or date of death, and are often calculated from an age given in the source.

lists the tombstone inscriptions and numbers the markers in section/row order with a name index and a map to assist in locating a particular stone. "Part IV is our original reading of TDC, now administered by SMC personnel. Following this is a list of known burials in this section, as found in our research of newspaper obituaries for the years 1916-1921. We know there were many others..."

History from website, http://www.seasdunkirkny.org/stmary.html: Early in the 1850's the pastor and parishioners of the fledgling St. Mary's Church decided that they needed a cemetery for their new parish. Land was purchased on Bennett Rd. and the first burial took place in August 1851. Eventually we acquired the adjacent "Potter's Field", originally designated for the poor and destitute. This consecrated land continues to point to our common belief in the resurrection of the body and serves as a focal point for families who hand their deceased loved ones over to God's Embrace. [note: it was never ALL Potter's Field, but remember that this is the church version] Also, a note is inserted in Row 17 names as to the uncertainty where ToD cemetery ends and StM cem begins... in row 17 is Father Raffaele Fabbozzi, 1851-1931, on a cross, which is probably a good clue.

There is already some question as to whether Dunkirk Cemetery and St. Mary's Cemetery were used interchangeably at times and in other sources. Note that a partial index for Dunkirk Cemetery can be found on pp. 243–246, while there are two indexes for the St. Mary's Cemetery: 2a., at the front of the book, is an index to the tombstones found in 1990 and leads to locations; 2b. pp. 167-239, to the complete burial records from 1851-1911. All names in the Dunkirk Cemetery section are included here and referenced by page... followed by an M if from the markers read section... and please remember how difficult it is to read old markers! When possible, names were re-checked in Observer indexes (source #15) where 9s become 4s, 7s become 2s, etc. It could not hurt to re-check census records and Observer indexes, using creative spelling when you find a discrepancy in this finding aid and/or other sources.

Forest Hill Cemetery (FHC) consists of about 40 acres in the Village of Fredonia, NY. The entrance is on Lambert Avenue. Formerly a private cemetery, it is now owned and maintained by the Town of Pomfret. Record books survive, and Town of Pomfret personnel are available for questions by appointment. This transcript consists of data from the "Burials by Date" section of Record Books One, Two, and Three. It covers known burials from the mid-1850s into 2007. Some maiden names, spouse names, and related items have been have been added from other sources by the transcribers, Lois and Norwood Barris. The "Tiffany" note in a notes field indicates that this interment was also found in the burial records (Oct 1858 to Feb 1867) of Jesse M Tiffany, Fredonia undertaker...

The interment record data from original log books deciphered and digitized by Lois and Norwood Barris (2007). This effort was assisted by Audrey Schmoyers. Web files were prepared by Nathan Towne...

Pioneer Cemetery, formerly known as "The Fredonia Cemetery" or "The Old Burying Grounds," was reputedly begun in 1808. It is located on East Main Street in the Village of Fredonia [adjacent to FHC.] The first surviving index and a map of known interments compiled by Village Engineer E. A. Wilder in 1908-09...Jack Blodgett's reading in the 1970s... and Douglas Shepard's reading in 2006.

4. Barris, Lois. Dunkirk Cemetery. Published article in The Chautauqua Genealogist, v.24, no. 3, August 2001, pp. 41, 43-49.

Articles and names found during research projects in the *Dunkirk Evening Observer* (cited as DO) are collected here. Lois generously shared the text, making it useful as a specific reference to information sometimes mentioned elsewhere.

Unclaimed and unknown bodies were buried by Coroner Blood in DTC, including: on 26 Dec 1882, a man killed at Woodward's Crossing 5 weeks earlier; 28 Jul 1885, an "Italian tramp" was killed by a train near Sheridan and the Silver Creek Local editor suggested it was a waste of coroner Blood's expensive fluid to embalm such a person; a Polish man about 45 d. Nov 1914, buried 4 Jun 1915; a man about 40, killed on tracks ner Van Buren 9 Sep 1915, bur 18 Sep 1915. (4:41)

Pages 43-49 contain more or less detailed information (and spelling) from obituaries in the Dunkirk Observer that specifically stated, "buried in Dunkirk Cemetery." Information is abbreviated, wife and/or children names might be given. This list in addition to those names listed in St. Mary's book (2).

4:49b: Chautauqua News 17 May 1882: A poor deaf mute was around Dunkirk a day or two and Saturday somebody put him on a Lake Shore train westward. Having no money he was put off at Morian's Station and he staggered over to Otis Hall's. Mr Hall saw that he was sick and sent word to porrmaster Cottrell who decided to bring him up to Mr Matthew Fuller's hoping that Mr Fuller's daughter, who is similarly afflicted, could communicate with him. The poor fellow sank rapidly after reaching Mr. Fuller's and died that Sunday. From papers found in his pocket it appears that his name was Charles Johnson and he had a mother in St Louis, but a telegram sent there failed to find her. The deceased was buried Tuesday at the expense of the town. Rev J A Bummer kindly conducted the burial service. (from Fredonia Censor).

5. Map of the Town of Dunkirk Cemetery, copied full-size courtesy of Denise Griggs and Add Lumber, from the copy of the brown paper original in the collection of the Dunkirk Historical Museum, copied by F.C.B [in 1974 by F. C. Buckries per Nolo] and scanned by County Historian Michelle Henry.

A reduced version of this map also appears in Source 2, p. 247. Neither date of original map nor identity of map maker is known at this time.

Note that "row" seems to apply to parts of this map, not so much to others. Deciding how to (or whether to) refer to it in specifics is still being decided and is further complicated in that the only existing reading (Nolo, 1990) raises a question, were the original western rows affected by reconstruction (widening) of Bennett Road? e.g., what happened to "G.A.R. 39" grave(s) in the "first row," if there ever were any? Were they moved to the G.A.R. section in FHC? Was this lot set aside but never actually used? Will we have more questions than answers at the end of this project?

When using this map, remember that the arrow pointing North (toward Dunkirk) puts the N-S fence on Bennett Road. A useful reference point is the large marker for Civil War veteran John Schultz at the north end of the "third row" in from Bennett Road, obvious on the map and still very legible today (unfortunately, his wife isn't mentioned on the stone, but she will be listed here!)

Note that Lois and Norwood "commenced this work at the corner of Bennett Road and the drive separating this old TDC and the old section of SMC, listed each row starting at the drive and walking north (parallel to Bennett Road / Rte. 60.) and their rows were given arbitrary, ascending numbers counting west to east" (i.e., away from Rte. 60.) The earliest burial they were able to identify was that of Louise P. Newman, 16 Apr 1864, which was incidentally, the first stone they read. Note that they found John Schultz at the north end of their Row 4, which makes accurately "mapping" the actual, original gravesites problematical at best and crazy-making at worst. As Nolo noted, there were undoubtedly many others buried here and their obituaries did not always specify a cemetery, possibly assuming this one?

Extractions of births, deaths, marriages and a few other events of interest to family historians. Published in Dunkirk, this paper covered events of interest to the grape farmers from North East PA to Angola NY along the shores of Lake Erie...

9. Douglas Shepard research.

9a. The "Cemetery" block is marked on the Smith-Nevins 1834 map of Dunkirk but the square is marked "Donation to endow an Academy" on the 1838 Nevins map, but it continued to be used until 1872.

9b. I just checked the George Ryman notebooks which have references to Dunkirk folks being buried in Pioneer. None seem to be re-burials.

10. United States Census, online at ancestry.com

Cited as 10:year of census and used to determine date of birth

11. Findagrave.com

Forest Hill Cemetery records (11:FHC) from late 1854 through about 1930, plus most through 2006 were uploaded in 2008 project. Individuals have added additional records since for many local cemeteries.

12. Other research. To be used for information found while researching other families. Identified by author and name of Word document, or copied from email, at this point, e.g.

12a. Kaufman, Jo Ann. Schult/Schultz families... my 3G Grandfather and his oldest daughter, Mary, seem to have been buried here but not moved to FHC, making both John Schultz and Johann Schult (also Schultz over here) my nephew's 4G grandfathers and the original curious and curiouser information leading to this project. John and Wilhelmina Brandt Shultz info now in FHC families document with other Schultz families.

12b.1. Crisanti, Sally Bolling. Email, 30 May 2013: Just found Elizabeth Bolling age 5 days, 1865 "under tree 6th and Swan. She was the daughter of Adolph Ernst Wilhelm Bolling and Sophia Dorthea Henrika Prahl Bolling. Also Maria Sophia Caroline Bolling died very young in 1856 but I do not have burial info listed.

12b.2. SedImayer, Walter. The map shows a plot for "G.A.R. Post #39." Walt is our resident military historian and he confirmed that Dunkirk's GAR Post was #393 (and Fredonia's was #403, so that is not a mix-up.) Some members were buried at Forest Hill, in a lot purchased by the Post for their indigent members. Search FHC online records for Lot G/43, William O. Stevens Post 393; also, some others are buried in nearby lots, but whether any were actually removed from Dunkirk has not been determined. See the Chautauqua County GenWeb site for a list of the Post 393 members, copied from the original register (Dunkirk Historical Society) and posted by Donna Mills.

13. SedImayer, Walt. **Pomfret Death Records, December 1890 – December 1899**; transcribed from Town of Pomfret records. Chautauqua Genealogist, v. 36, n.1, May 2013, pp. 21-23+.

Assuming that "buried Dunkirk" means the Town Cemetery but also adding names of those specifically "buried St. Mary's" at this time, in case terms were used interchangably in the records. Also, some records do not give cemetery information; those with German connection added here, too, for now.
